SECTION 4. First-Aid Measures

SECTION 5. Fire-Fighting Measures

UNUSUAL FIRE AND EXPLOSION HAZARDS: Highly flammable liquid and vapor. Vapors/dust may form explosive mixture with air. Vapors can travel to a source of ignition and flash back. Empty containers retain product residue (liquid and/or vapor) and can be dangerous. DO NOT pressurize, cut, weld, braze, solder, drill, grind, or expose such containers to heat, flame, sparks, static electricity, or other sources of ignition. STORAGE: Keep away from heat, sparks, and flame. Store containers in a cool, well ventilated place. Keep container closed when not in use. Dike storage containers to contain 110% of tank volume. Vent indoor tanks to an outside location so escaping vapors will not contaminate any work areas.
